SUBJECT: COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROPOSED FY' 08 ACTIVITIES

The Town of West Greenwich is in the midst of preparing its Community Development Block Grant Application for the FY '2000 funding cycle. The application has been drafted, reviewed by the Planning Board, and is due to the Office of Housing and Community Development on April 17th.

The purpose of this evening's meeting is to conduct the second of two required public hearings and to authorize submission of the application by Town Council resolution

The following is summary of the proposed activities presented in order of priority as recommended by the Planning Board.

Blueberry Heights Utilities: Funds in the amount of \$ 209,000 are requested to assist this previously funded housing development relocate its essential electrical service line to property owned by the development.

Housing Information Program: Funds in the amount of \$3,000 are requested to operate this fair housing information activity. The program is operated by Narragansett Affordable Housing and constitutes the Town's CDBG required fair housing obligation.

Washington County Community Development Corporation: Funds in the amount of \$5,000 are requested to support operations of this new non-profit affordable housing development corporation established to assist communities in "South County" implement their affordable housing plans.

Community Housing Land Trust: Funds in the amount of \$3,000 are requested to support operations of this new non-profit corporation established to provide state-wide land trust and affordable homeownership services. The CHLT has this year established a foreclosure intervention and recapture program to its portfolio of services.

South County Community Action: Funds in the amount of \$20,000 are requested to support the cost of enrolling 20 eligible individuals from the Town into a comprehensive Job Training/Placement program. This activity responds to the increasing number of displaced workers residing in South County. Individual Employment Plans will be created for each participant to assure the success of the intensive retraining and skill upgrades to follow.

Program Administration: \$ 10,000

TOTAL REQUESTED \$ 250,000

Whereas the West Greenwich Town Council, recognizing the importance to the character of our community and our quality of life, has continually sought to preserve and protect the valuable open space of the town; and

Whereas the Comprehensive Plan for the Town of West Greenwich includes objectives for open space acquisition and preservation in a manner consistent with the State Guide; and

Whereas the citizens of the Town of West Greenwich overwhelmingly voted to approve the last two state wide open space bond referendums for open space preservation, outdoor recreation facilities and Narragansett Bay restoration; and

Whereas in 2006 the citizens of the Town of West Greenwich overwhelmingly approved a local eight million dollar open space referendum; and

Whereas Town of West Greenwich projects financed in part with state Open Space Bond funds have enabled the town to implement our adopted Comprehensive Community Plan, preserve our community character and enhance our quality of life by protecting open land; and

Whereas RIDEM funds for open space acquisition programs from the 2004 Bond are nearly exhausted; it is now therefore

Resolved that the West Greenwich Town Council supports the efforts of the State of Rhode Island to gain approval of a 2008 bond referendum for open space preservation and strongly urges the support of the Office of the Governor and the Rhode Island General Assembly to authorize this measure for the statewide ballot in November, 2008; and it is further

Resolved that the West Greenwich Town Council recommends that the Rhode Island General Assembly authorize a 2008 bond referendum that provides \$15 million for open space protection programs.
